Campaign/Toolkit Objectives & Goals

MRR members and friends will educate the public about:

- How Minnesotans fund motorized recreation
- Publicly funded damage being done to our communities, parks, forests & environment
- The routine violation of publicly funded grant agreements by local units of government & clubs
- Lack of accountability in the misuse of public funds for motorized recreation
- MRR's campaign to reform public funding of motorized recreation

MRR members will work to redirect public funding of motorized recreation from promotion to mitigation of the noise, fumes, danger to others, and environmental damage caused by snowmobiles, ATVs, dirt-bike motorcycles and four-wheel drive trucks. MRR will work locally to require the following practices and policies for any publicly funded motorized route.

1. **Public and environmental review** to select routes for motorized recreation
2. **Designated routes only** policy requiring machines to stay on selected routes
3. **Adequate enforcement** to keep riders on selected routes
4. Funds to **repair accumulating damage**
5. **Oversight and accountability** to ensure above objectives are accomplished

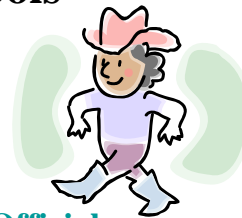
